FULL FACE MASK

Full Face Masks (FFM) are commonly used in military, commercial, and Public Safety Diving. They are gaining in popularity with recreational divers – mainly due to the ability to use underwater voice communications

A FFM covers the diver's entire face, which reduces the chances of exposure when diving in Contaminated Water. FFMs are also more secure and less-likely to be dislodged than a recreational-style half-mask. Divers using FFMs also report they feel warmer and experience less dry mouth and jaw fatigue after a day of diving.

FFMs can also serve as a platform to attach underwater voice communications systems, and lights, to.

Diving with a FFM is easy, but requires specialty training because normal operations and emergency/contingency procedures are different than with a standard regulator and half-mask.

For recreational divers: imagine being able to talk to your dive buddy(s) and the surface, or diving all day without jaw fatigue or dry throat at the end of the day. A FFM may be just what you need !

For professional divers: standardized training, along with proper certifications and qualifications are import for operations and risk management. If your divers are using FFMs, but don't have documented training in FFMs, you should consider a Specialty Course in Full Face Masks.

The FFM Specialty Course consists of: (2) hours classroom, (2) hours confined water, and (2) open water dives for certification. It is possible to complete FFM training in one day, if necessary.
